Packing a tent is encouraged, but not mandatory. Cadets, who choose not to bring a tent, must bring an extra 10' x 12' tarp as part of a shelter. Recommended size for tents is 2 to 4-man, but a 5 to 6-man is acceptable. Tents will be set up according to need and all tents may not be used. During the school, tents are used for sleeping only. All equipment is kept in a squadror equipment tent. If you do not own a tent do not purchase one just for the weekend.
