

# Let's Talk About Paths!

One of Volunteer University's (VolU) claims to fame over the legacy system of Senior Member (SM) Education and Training (ET) is the idea of of having everybody complete certain **core** classes on their ET journey and dive into ones specific to one of four (4) **paths** they choose. The four paths on offer are: new member, military, Cadet, and professional (I explain each below). Members are truly divided into their paths in Level 2, but they some exposure can be seen as early as the three-meeting pre-boarding script or the first modules of Level 1.

# Education and Training Overview

Are you a new member and looking to find answers to your ET questions? Have you tried to navigate AXIS, E-Services, and your levels? Do you just have guestions on how to get around and where to go next?

Over the next month or so, Pennsylvania Wing ETOs will be running an introductory course to help answer the questions and get everyone more familiar with the program.

This is not to get you into being a VolU Instructor but just to help get you started on your journey through the senior education that we go through with CAP.

#### **Newsletter Submissions**



- You do NOT need any qualifications to submit content to the ET Newsletter.



# Volunteer University Gains New Leader



It was announced in the <u>October 4, 2022 PROPS</u> that Col Bryan W. Cooper, former RIWG/CC, would succeed Col Joe Winter as Chief of Education and Training for CAP. Col Winter followed in the footsteps of Brigadier General Regena Aye.

Col Bryan Cooper, a former Rhode Island Wing Commander with a vast CAP and professional background, was selected last fall to lead Volunteer University as the Civil Air Patrol Chief of Education and Training. He also served as the National Professional Development Officer, NER Character Development Instructor, NER Deputy Chief of Staff for Aerospace Education, NER Director of Recruiting and Retention, RIWG Chief of Staff, RIWG Director of Personnel, and RIWG Director of Administration. Cooper succeeds Col Joe Winter, who served as the Chief since August 2021, and Brig Gen Regena Aye, who served as the inaugural Chief of Education and Training, beginning in

August 2020. Col Cooper also served with the National Mentoring Committee, conducting onboarding interviews and training and in quality assurance.

In these roles, Col Cooper been awarded National Moral Leadership Officer of the Year, a Brewer Award, the Air Force Organizational Excellence Award, three (3) Distinguished Service Awards, eight (8) Exceptional Service Awards, 11 Meritorious Service Awards, National Commander Commendation, the Gill Robb Wilson (#729) Award, Command Service Award with Silver Star, Crossfield Award, CAP Crisis Service Award, Earhart Award with Silver Star and Silver Clasp, CAC Ribbon, numerous encampment and NCSA Ribbons, and a cluster for his 20th Find.

His specialty track ratings include master's ratings in Public Affairs, Recruiting and Retention, Command, Personnel, and Aerospace; senior ratings in Cadet Programs, Chaplain, and Administration; and technician ratings in Plans and Programs, Finance, and Inspector General.


In the 4 Oct 22 issue of PROPS, CAP's internal E-newsletter, Col Cooper was quoted saying: "at every step in a CAP career you need education and training... the ET team and I are committed to providing applicable, high-quality, practical, and effective education and training that is accessible to every member."

The different paths really only flush out at LV2. When you return to LV3, everyone comes back together again. A chart similar to the one on the left first debuted in the August 2020 PAWG ET Newsletter.

In the event that you are eligible for multiple paths (ex: a doctor with substantial military officer experience), look at the coursework for each path. In consultation with your mentor, ETO, or Commander, pick the path that would be the most relevant to your CAP service moving forward.

The paths are designed to complement your duty assignment, specialty track, networking capabilities, and overall experience. You should really aim to align people with the proper path the first time.


#### How to read the infographic on page 8:

- 1. Find the level (Level 1, Level 2 Part 1, Region Commander Elective, etc.) and path (if applicable) in question.
- 2. Look at the **color** of the cells first.
  - a. Blue cells are automated.
    - b. **Orange** cells are moderated.
  - c. The modalities are defined and explained in further detail on the VolU Lexicon document.
- 3. Determine if any waivers exist by reading the text in the cell.
  - a. Any blue or orange cells containing text in it may be waived, IAW with CAPR 40-1.
  - b. The waivers are also briefly summarized in the legend.










# **New NCO Duty Performance Promotion Report**

To access the report:

- 1. Log into E-Services at capnhq.gov.
- 2. Go to the hamburger icon on the left side of the screen (viewer's left).
- 3. Click Reports.
- 4. Click Member Reports.
- 5. Click on the **red** Member Reports (this red text is actually a drop-down menu).
- 6. Click on Member Reports (under the Modules heading).
- 7. Select NCO Duty Assignment Promotion Report from the first dropdown menu.

NOTE: If you check the box for "Include Contact Report," you will download a ZIP file with two (2) files in it the: promotion report itself and a list of contact information (email,

phone number, address) for everyone on the report.




